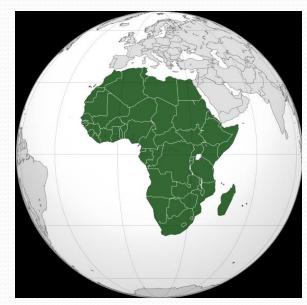

Is my product eligible?

 Any product that meets U.S. laws can enter the U.S. market

- It may also be eligible for duty-free entry:
 - AGOA
 - Generalized System of Preferences (GSP)
 - Most Favored Nation (MFN)



Is my product eligible for preferential entry into the US?

1. Country Eligibility

 US President designates according to criteria which may change

2. Product Eligibility

- Generalized System of Preferences (GSP) may be available for countries that are not AGOA-eligible
 - Lapsed and waiting for renewal
- African Growth & Opportunity Act (AGOA) extends GSP benefits to an additional 1,800 products
 - Currently expires September 30, 2015

Is my product eligible for preferential entry into the US?

Country Eligibility Criteria

Is my product eligible for duty-free entry into the US?

Product Eligibility Criteria (Excluding apparel/textiles)

RULES OF ORIGIN (AGOA & GSP)

Wholly grown, produced or manufactured in-country OR



Value of materials produced in-country + direct processing costs in-country <u>or</u> in customs union (including up to 15% in US) - combining/packing/dilution =/> 35% of value of good at time of entry into the U.S.

AND

Imported directly into the U.S.

Is my product eligible for duty-free entry into the US?

Eligibility Criteria (Apparel/textiles)

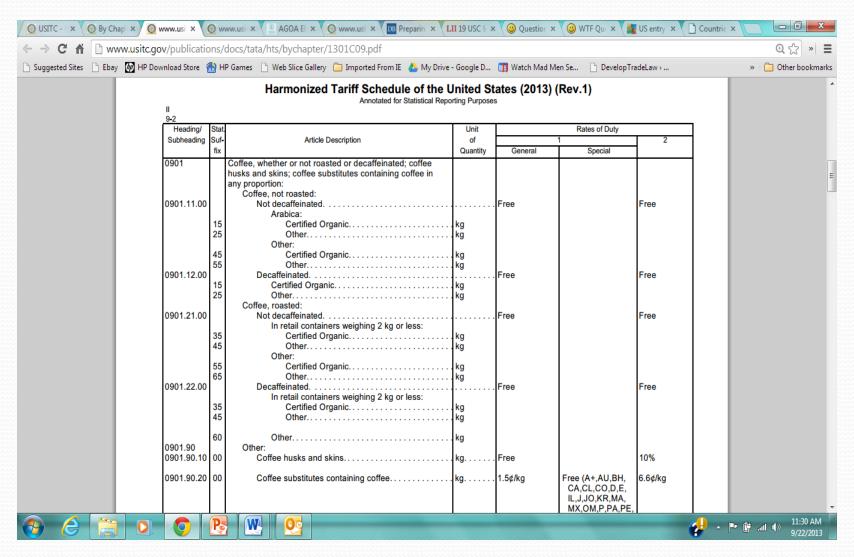


- Countries: determined to have instituted procedures to protect against unlawful transshipments (visa system)
- **Products**: HTSUS, Chapter 98, subchapter XIX http://www.usitc.gov/publications/docs/tata/hts/bychapter/1301C98.pdf

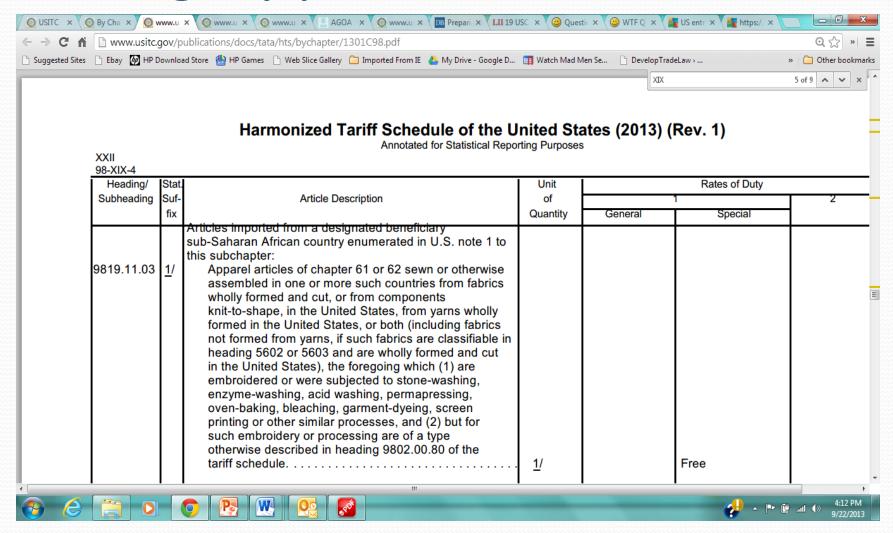
Getting my product in free

- Product Eligibility Criteria
- Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS)
 Online Reference Tool -- http://hts.usitc.gov/
- General Rate = duty rate for MFN trade partners
- Special Rates = preferential rates for FTA or developing country trade partners
 - D = eligible for AGOA
 - $A^+ = LDC$ eligibility for GSP
 - A = GSP eligible

Getting my product in free: Coffee



Getting my product in free: Dress



- Importers are legally required to:
- Have complete invoice, including accurate description and value of product
- Correctly classify goods
- Correctly value the goods
- If eligible, claim AGOA (or GSP) status
- Pay the correct duties
- Correctly and clearly identify the country of origin
- Properly package and mark or label
- Comply with entry requirements for the relevant agencies
- Textile and apparel products require a visa
- Prepare and keep ALL supporting documentation



- US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) also enforces the entry requirements of numerous other agencies:
 - Food & Drug Administration (FDA)

 - US Department of Agriculture (USDA)
 - US Patent & Trademark Office (USPTO)
- Most products are permitted so long as they meet the requirements of the relevant agency



Protect your intellectual property

- DO patent your invention
- DO register your trademark



- **DO copyright** original works of creativity (e.g. song, painting, book)
- DO protect your trade name
- DO protect your trade secrets

Use a customs broker; Importers are **legally** required to:

- Comply with Importer Security Filing requirements by providing advance <u>electronic</u> notification of cargo arriving by ship
- Verify the security of the supply chain
 - Enroll in C-TPAT
 - Use BASC-certified logistical providers
 - Know or verify the supplier -http://www.treas.gov/offices/enforcement/ofac/sdn



Compliance Tools

- Develop a Compliance Manual describing the rules and outlining internal controls
- Get compliance software
